words we know in the room, copying words around the room)

- *learning about letters (singing the alphabet, reading the alphabet, putting letters in alphabetical order, calling out the letters in the name of the day, jumping the alphabet, matching letters and sounds)
- *learning more about math (counting children each morning, adding a straw to the holder each day, writing numerals, estimating, sorting and patterning math tub pieces, naming shapes, adding and comparing numbers, making graphs and reading them to compare, keeping track of how many days we've been in kindergarten)

And this is only the beginning! I look forward to helping your child reach his/her potential this year. Kindergarten will be filled with so many fun learning activities. You'll be amazed at how much your child will know!

I've been blessed with another wonderful class this year—lots of different personalities, lots of different talents.
