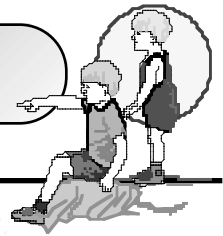


MGA Kindergarten Connections



Homework Study Sheet for: January 14-18

Bible Lesson and Memory Verse:

“God said, ‘Let us make man in our image.’” Genesis 1:26

We are reading stories about Ester and Ruth.

Math: Continue to count objects around the house (one to one correspondence). Put them in **categories and classify them. Point out same and different.... Distinguish between left, right, top, bottom, up, down, before, after, etc.... Please start looking at coins with your child. Help them recognise a penny, nickel, dime, and quarter. Help them learn to count coins..... Please review the days of the week and the months of the year. Ask your child what day comes BEFORE_____ or what day comes after _____.... Don't assume** that your child can count and/or say his/her **ABC's** and that he/she **knows** their **sounds** OR knows them by **sight**..... **Keep going back over it.**

Language Arts:

Parents, **Continue working on the gross and fine motor skill ideas I sent home.** We are studying our second “bad guy” letter. These are letters that do not say their sound. We are studying the letter “Cc”. Its soft sound is made by making a “voiced” soft sound. the tongue’s sides are up against your top teeth as you make the sound of a snake. Your mouth is slightly open as you push out your breathe. Its hard sound is like the letter “K”. You make a hard “voiced” blow. Your tongue is curled slightly and the edges are in the same position as when you make the soft sound. Have your child feel his/her throat and mouth as she/he sounds the letter “Cc”. Does a lot of air come out of your mouth? Does your throat vibrate? Look for things around the house that begin with this letter. Go over the letters we have studied: **Ss, Tt, Bb, Ff, Pp, Rr, Dd, Jj, Kk, Ll, Mm, Nn, Vv, Xx, Zz.** Make sure your child can **identify these and make their sound.** These are “good guy” letters because **they say their sound.** Have your child **write these letters using the capital and lower case. And don't forget Hh, and Cc.** Students, please **continue to practice writing your name.** Remember we only use a capital at the beginning of our first, middle, and last name. We are having trouble making our lower case “A”. Please help us by practicing at home with your child. **Start putting sounds together: at words, ad words, an words, etc. than go on with ed, en, et, etc., it, in, id, etc., od, ot, on, etc., ut, un, ud, etc.....**

Many of us still do not know our **address, phone number, and birthdate.** Let's keep practising. Many of us can not **tie our shoes?** **Please keep practicing these at home.... These are homework assignments. Thank you....**
